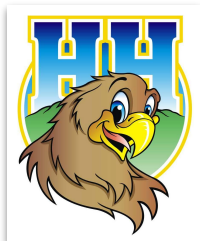

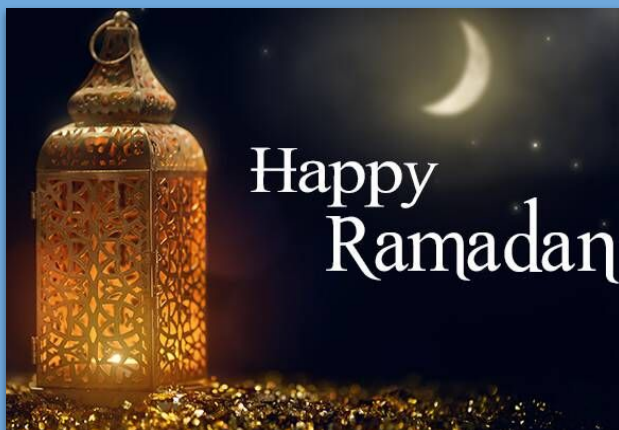

Independent Study Request for Pre-Determined Absences

Dear Parents of Grade 2 Students,

Your second grade student will have the opportunity to take the Cognitive Abilities Test (CogAT) during the window of May 2 - May 20, 2022. **Our school, Hidden Hills Elementary, will be testing on May 10, 11, and 12.** CogAT is a nationally normed standardized abilities test that is widely used across the country. It is not a basic skills or an achievement test. In the San Ramon Valley Unified School District, the results of CogAT are used to identify students for Gifted and Talented Education (GATE). Teachers do not use the results to assess your child's progress at school. In addition, these results have no impact on students' access to accelerated, honors, or advanced courses in future years.

Because the CogAT is primarily used for the purpose of GATE identification, the testing may not be necessary for all students. In particular, it may cause anxiety in some students and not be in their best interest to participate. If you prefer that your child not take the CogAT exam, you may **opt out by completing this form by Monday, April 25, 2022.** Please note, if you do not opt out, your child will be given the test.

If your child takes the CogAT, results will not be available until late summer, 2022, and will be posted on Campus Portal. Results will be based on Grade Percentile Rank scores. Additional information about GATE is available on the District website: <http://www.srvusd.net/GATE>.

Dear Parent/Guardian/Caregiver:

Each year at our school, students in grades three through five participate in the California Assessment of Student Performance and Progress (CAASPP). This assessment window is scheduled for April 11th through May 6th. Each student will take these assessments on their SRVUSD issued chromebook. These chromebooks have been updated with the latest web browser that supports the State of California tests. Students will take the Smarter Balanced Summative Assessments for English language arts/literacy and mathematics. Fifth grade students will also take the California Science Test (CAST).

The Smarter Balanced Summative Assessments and the CAST are online tests that measure what your child has learned. The test results help our school understand what knowledge and skills students have mastered and which ones they may still need to learn. These scores allow parents and teachers to monitor student progress so we can help each student master the appropriate grade level academic standards. It's very important that each student takes the exam and tries their best. Overall, the CAASPP scores reflect on our students, schools and school district. You are an important part of your child's education. To help your child prepare for the test you can:

- Talk about the test with your child. Make sure they are not scared or anxious.
- Tell your child that they have learned the material in their classroom.
- Take advantage of the online practice tests if you so choose.
- Make sure your child gets a good night's sleep and a nutritious breakfast before testing.

Day of Silence in San Ramon Valley Unified School District

April 22, 2022

What is the Day of Silence?

- This year's Day of Silence takes place on Friday, April 22nd
- Observed by students who may choose to take a daylong vow of silence as a show of empathy and support for those students who feel voiceless, isolated and alone
- While concentrated on LGBTQ+ students, the Day of Silence is a day to show support for all students who may not be able to be their authentic selves
- That silence is broken after school by student groups throughout the District



A Brief History of the Day of Silence

- Began in 1996
- Students from all 50 states, many different countries and many of our SRVUSD schools may participate
- Initiated in the SRVUSD by LGBTQ+ high school students and spread to middle schools and elementary schools
- March 8, 2016: SRVUSD students, in conjunction with SRVEA, successfully petitioned our Board for the first resolution in support of the Day of Silence

Why do we celebrate the Day of Silence?

The Day of Silence is SRVUSD at our best:

- A student driven initiative to collectively practice empathy and hope and as a message of hope to those students, particularly in our LGBTQ+ community, who feel alone

Touches on what is important to us:

- Social-Emotional Well-Being, Equity, and Deep Learning

What do we ask of our sites on the Day of Silence?

- Maintain a respectful environment for those who choose to participate in the Day of Silence
- Commit to maintaining a safe environment daily for our LGBTQ+ communities every day of the year
- Commit to reaching out to students who feel alone and isolated

- Support student groups to determine what they need to safely participate in the Day of Silence
- Fly the progress flags at every school site on April 22, 2022 (Progress flag will be flown under the US flag and California flag.)

How can I see if my employer can match my donation?

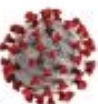

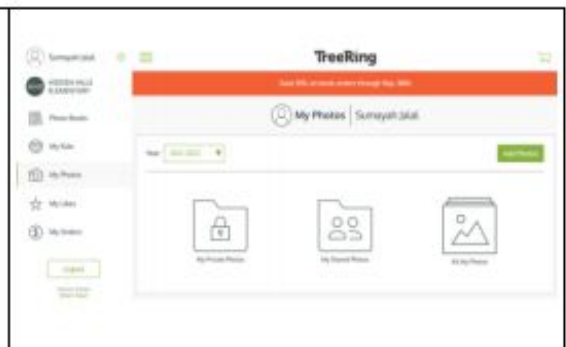

STEP 1: Add Photo

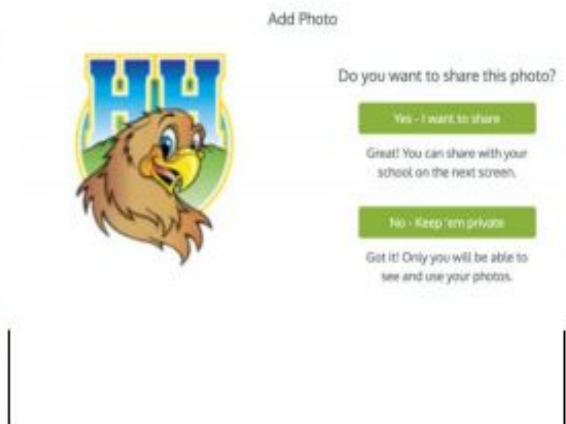
- Click on 'My Photos'
